The regular meeting of the Wellsville City Council was held on Wednesday, June 24th 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Wellsville City Hall meeting room, located at 411 Main Street. The Mayor asked for a list of provisions regarding the rules and regulations that would pertain to this event for the next meeting.

Dave Rogers moved to accept Resolution 01-24-2015 a permit to let the Joint Recreation Commission for operation of maintenance vehicle within the city. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilman Jared Eggleston moved to purchase the court laptop computer from Sanders Software. Councilman Cory Cunningham seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Chief John Blair gave the police department activity report. Chief Blair stated they had to replace tires on one of the SUV's. Officer Foltz completed the School Resource training. Chief Blair stated that a new server had to be purchased at the Police Department. Chief reported that several people have picked up applications and they will start interviewing.

Building Inspector Wes Brown estimates that 120 homes do not have good addressing on the buildings, including City Hall and the Library. He would like to proceed with this project.
